

# Croda Community Notification System

As part of our commitment to safety and socially responsible business practices, we have a dedicated alarm to notify our community in the event of an emergency.

Croda's Atlas Point facility has an audible community alarm, the "Croda Community Notification System" (CCNS), separate from our site-only alarms for employees, to alert the community to situations, if ever needed. Working in cooperation with the New Castle County Office of Emergency Management, the CCNS would be used to notify neighbors of an emergency.



## Testing schedule

The CCNS is tested on the second Tuesday of February, May, August, and November at 7:00 pm. Each test will last for 1 minute. **No action** is required by residents who hear these tests.

In 2022, the CCNS will be tested on:

- February 8
- May 10
- August 9
- November 8

## How does it work?

The CCNS is an audible speaker system which projects an emergency tone to people living and working near the Croda plant. The CCNS will be activated in the event of an emergency at the Croda facility where the surrounding community would be required to take action. When the CCNS is activated, the neighboring community will hear a tone that will sound in a steady manner for five minutes.

## What should I do if I hear it?

If you hear this steady tone for 5 minutes outside of the test schedule listed above, please tune to one of the emergency broadcast stations listed below for further instructions.
